If you are 10 or 12 or 14 years old and have written, say, a cracking good villanelle — spurn the Young Person's category and go straight to the Villanelle section.

The judges are: Drina Hampson, a Classics teacher; Tony Collins, a publisher; Pen Wilcock, a writer whose published work includes poetry.
